Two Characteristics of The Prophet Jonah

A. The prophet was <u>stubborn</u>.

Jonah 1:17–2:1, NASB95 - ¹⁷ And the LORD appointed a great fish to swallow Jonah, and Jonah was in the stomach of the fish three days and three nights. ¹ Then Jonah prayed to the LORD his God from the stomach of the fish....

What will it take for you to cry out to God?

B. But the prophet was <u>saved</u>.

Jonah 2:2, HCSB - ² I called to the LORD in my distress, and He answered me. I cried out for help in the belly of Sheol; You heard my voice.



1. The prophet *finally* prayed to God for help.

Jonah 2:2, NLT - ² He said, "<u>I cried out to the LORD in my great trouble</u>, and he answered me. I called to you from the land of the dead, and LORD, you heard me!

2. The prophet *finally* accepted the Lord's discipline.

Jonah 2:3, NCV - ³ <u>You threw me into the sea</u>, down, down into the deep sea. The water was all around me, and your powerful waves flowed over me.

3. The prophet *finally* trusted God's promises.

Jonah 2:4–7, NASB95 - ⁴ "So I said, 'I have been expelled from Your sight. Nevertheless I will look again toward Your holy temple [the purpose of the temple was to point to the Ultimate Sacrifice—Jesus Christ].'... The earth with its bars was around me forever, But You have brought up my life from the pit, O LORD my God. ⁷ "While I was fainting away, I remembered the LORD, And my prayer came to You, Into Your holy temple.

4. The prophet finally yielded to God's will.

Jonah 2:8–9, NIV84 -8 "Those who cling to worthless idols forfeit the grace that could be theirs. 9 But I, with a song of thanksgiving, will sacrifice to you. What I have vowed I will make good. Salvation comes from the LORD."

JONAH - Life Application Section

- A. Like Jonah, realize that only God can help you—only He can save.
- B. Like Jonah, realize that your sin placed you where you are.
- C. Like Jonah, realize that God will stop at nothing to get your attention.
- D. Like Jonah, realize you must recommit to God's will in your life.
