## Big Picture Review of Chapter Four

### A. Don't be controlled by yesterday (the past) vv. 1-6

People who have been born again through faith in Christ should not allow the old life to control or drag them down.

### B. Be serious about today (the present) vv. 7-11

No matter how difficult life may be, we must not focus on ourselves, but Christ, for there is a job to do.

### C. Be prepared for tomorrow (the future) vv. 12-19

The future will be worse before it gets better. We must be ready for the "fiery trial" that is about to come over the church.



## Marching Orders for this Hostile World

### 1. The Incentive.

**STUDY VERSE SECTION - 1 Peter 4:7a, NASB95** <sup>-7</sup> *The end [lit., consummation; meaning a purpose will be attained] of all things [this clearly speaks of the Lord's return] is near [lit., approaching without warning]. . .*

1 Peter 4:7, NLT <sup>-7</sup> *The end of the world is coming soon.*

### 2. The Instructions.

#### A. Prayerful Holiness

**STUDY VERSE SECTION - 1 Peter 4:7, NASB95** <sup>-7</sup> *The end of all things is near; therefore, be of sound judgment [lit., be in one's right mind; it means not to be carried away by an errant view of oneself, or an undue emotion, or an uncontrolled passion (Kittel)] and sober spirit [meaning spiritually observant; spiritually clear headed for God; be on spiritual alert] for the purpose of prayer.*

#### B. Mutual Love

**STUDY VERSE SECTION - 1 Peter 4:8-9, NASB95** <sup>-8</sup> *Above all, keep fervent [i.e., straining, like an athlete running] in your love [a self-sacrificing, God-inspired love] for one another [a rf., to fellow believers], because love covers a multitude of sins [rf., Proverbs 10:12]. <sup>9</sup> Be hospitable [to love strangers] to one another without complaint [lit., mummering; Poor Richard's Almanac states, "Fish and guests smell after three days" (That's not hospitality)].*

#### C. Spiritual Service

**STUDY VERSE SECTION - 1 Peter 4:10-11, NASB95** <sup>-10</sup> *As each one has received a special [spiritual] gift [def. "Special enablements given graciously to Christians as an aid in the discharge of the special orders to which God has called them" (Wuest)], employ it in serving one another as good stewards [i.e., we don't own them; we are simple stewards of them] of the manifold [grace of God].<sup>11</sup> Whoever speaks [i.e., outward gifts], is to do so as one who is speaking the utterances of God; whoever serves [i.e., inward gifts], is to do so as one who is serving by the strength which God supplies. . .*

### 3. The Intention.

**STUDY VERSE SECTION - 1 Peter 4:11b, NASB95** <sup>-11</sup> *...so that in all things God may be glorified [this is the goal of every believer] through Jesus Christ, to whom belongs the glory [focused recognition and/or majestic honor] and dominion [authority over everything] forever and ever. Amen.*

1 Corinthians 10:31, NASB95 <sup>-31</sup> *...whatever you do, do all to the glory of God.*

### LIFE APPLICATION SECTION

Two Important Words to Ponder:

#### Urgency and Simplicity

In light of His coming and in light of the glory He deserves:

We must have a sacrificial attitude toward Christ.  
We must have a sympathetic attitude toward mankind.
