STUDY SECTION

Important Truths about the Fiery Trials of Life

1. Expect fiery trials.

<u>STUDY VERSE SECTION - 1 Peter 4:12, NASB95</u> - ¹² Beloved, do not be surprised at the <u>fiery ordeal</u> [Gk: pyrōsis, portrays figuratively a painful experience, suffering and/or persecution] among you, which comes upon you for your <u>testing</u> [the word is used of a furnace melting down metal to purge it of impurities], as though some strange thing were happening to you....

James 1:2–3, NASB95 - ² Consider it all joy, my brethren, <u>when</u> you encounter various trials, ³ knowing that the <u>testing of your faith</u> produces endurance.

Hard times develop character in each of us.

2. Exalt God in fiery trials.

STUDY VERSE SECTION - 1 Peter 4:13–14, NASB95 - 13 but to the degree that you share [lit., relate to] the sufferings of Christ, keep on rejoicing, so that also at the revelation of His glory you may rejoice with exultation [lit., rapturous joy, overjoyed]. 14 If you are reviled [lit., insulted] for the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you.

Luke 6:22–23, NIV84 - ²² Blessed are you when men hate you, when they exclude you and insult you and reject your name as evil, because of the Son of Man. ²³ "Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, because great is your reward in heaven. For that is how their fathers treated the prophets.

Hard times will bring us closer to God.

3. Evaluate yourself in fiery trials.

STUDY VERSE SECTION - 1 Peter 4:15–18, NASB95 - 15 Make sure that none of you suffers as a murderer, or thief, or evildoer, or a troublesome meddler; 16 but if anyone suffers as a Christian [lit., "little Christ"—used only three times in the NT (here and in Acts 11:26 & Acts 26:28); it began as an insult but later, a badge of honor in the first century church], he is not to be ashamed [lit., dishonored], but is to glorify God in this name. 17 For it is time for judgment to begin with the household of God; and if it begins with us first, what will be the outcome for those who do not obey the gospel of God? 18 AND IF IT IS WITH DIFFICULTY THAT THE RIGHTEOUS IS SAVED, WHAT WILL BECOME OF THE GODLESS MAN AND THE SINNER?

Why am I suffering?
Am I ashamed of glorifying Christ?
Am I seeking to win the lost in my suffering?

4. Entrust yourself to God in fiery trials.

<u>STUDY VERSE SECTION - 1 Peter 4:19, NASB95</u> - ¹⁹ Therefore, those also who suffer according to the will of God shall <u>entrust</u> [Gk: paratithhemi, is a banker's term referring to a deposit for safe keeping] their souls to a faithful <u>Creator</u> [used only here in NT] in doing what is <u>right</u> [God always does right].

Hard times teach us completely to trust in God.

In the trials of life, entrust yourself to God and rest in Him.
