3. A Theological Understanding about Suffering

- A. Suffering is a part of living in a "fallen" world.
 - i. Moral Evil (wicked people—NY on 9/11, mass shooting, etc.)

Jeremiah 17:9 (NLT) -9 The human <u>heart is most deceitful and desperately wicked</u>. Who really knows how bad it is?

Mark 7:21 (NIV) -²¹ For from within, <u>out of men's hearts, come</u> <u>evil thoughts</u>, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, ²² greed, malice, deceit, lewdness, envy, slander, arrogance and folly.

ii. Natural Evil (Accidents and Natural Disasters)

Romans 8:22 (NIV) -²² We know that the <u>whole creation has</u> <u>been groaning</u> as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time.

B. Suffering is unrelated to our own "personal goodness".

Matthew 5:45 (TLB) – [It] rains on the just and the unjust.

Luke 13:1-5 (NCV) - ¹ At that time some people were there who told Jesus that Pilate had killed some people from Galilee while they were worshiping. He mixed their blood with the blood of the animals they were sacrificing to God. ² Jesus answered, "Do you think this happened to them because they were more sinful than all others from Galilee? ³ No, I tell you ... ⁴ What about those eighteen people who died when the tower of Siloam fell on them? Do you think they were more sinful than all the others who live in Jerusalem? ⁵ No, I tell you. But unless you change your hearts and lives, you will all be destroyed too!"

C. Suffering amplifies God's message; we need a Savior—His name is Jesus!

Acts 17:29-31 (NIV) -²⁹ "Therefore ... we should not think that the divine being is like gold or silver or stone—an image made by man's design and skill. ³⁰ In the past God overlooked such ignorance, but now he commands all people everywhere to repent. ³¹ For he has set a day when he will judge the world with justice by the man he has appointed. He has given proof of this to all men by raising him from the dead."

2 Peter 3:9-10 (MSG) - God isn't late with his promise as some measure lateness. He is restraining himself on account of you, holding back the End because he doesn't want anyone lost. He's giving everyone space and time to change. But when the Day of God's Judgment does come, it will be unannounced, like a thief.

Study Verse Section—Romans 8:28, NASB95 - ²⁸ And we as Christians *know* intuitively and can experience personally *that* God causes lit., "harmonizes" *all* i.e., every single one--all *things* to work we get our English word "synergy" from this word together for good lit., "the good" to those who (1) love God, and (2) to those who are called according to His i.e., eternal purpose.

- **1. There is always something CONFIDENTIAL** about hard times. "And we know ... "
- **2.** There is always something **COMPREHENSIVE** about hard times "... that God causes all things ... "
- 3. There is always something **CONSTRUCTIVE** about the hard times.
 - "... that God causes all things to work together <u>for good</u>... "

 - "... to those who <u>love God</u>, to those who are <u>called according to His</u> purpose ... "
