

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Controlling Your Desires

Exodus 20:17

STUDY VERSE SECTION - Exodus 20:17, NASB95 -¹⁷ “You shall not [translates the one Hebrew word for “no” (אין “low”) an “absolute imperfect verb” denoting “a habitual action still in progress”] covet [Heb. חָסַד (tha-mood), Lit., to pant after; it's a ‘desire riot’ (MacClearen); it makes clear it's immoral to desire the wrong thing; this phrase is used here as a *reflective participle*; (eg., it is eminently right to desire and take pleasure in your own wife, but not another man's wife)] *YOUR neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife or his male servant or his female servant or his ox or his donkey or anything that belongs to your neighbor.*”

The Origin of Covetousness!

Mark 7:21–22, NASB95 -²¹ “For from within, out of the heart of men, proceed the evil thoughts, fornications, thefts, murders, adulteries,”²² deeds of coveting and wickedness...

2. Covetousness Examined.

The Progression of Covetousness!

Joshua 7:20–21, NASB95 -²⁰ So Achan answered Joshua and said, “Truly, I have sinned against the LORD, the God of Israel, and this is what I did:”²¹ when I saw among the spoil a beautiful mantle from Shinar and two hundred shekels of silver and a bar of gold fifty shekels in weight, then I coveted them and took them; and behold, they are concealed in the earth inside my tent with the silver underneath it.”
