## 1. The **START** of Christian Excellence.

**STUDY VERSE SECTION - 2 Peter 1:5, NASB95** – <sup>5</sup> Now for this very reason [rf., all God's promises to us—including salvation] also, applying [means "to bring in" or "to supply liberally"] all diligence ["zeal" and "eagemess" implies focus], in your faith [that saved you] <u>Supply</u> [Gk: ἐπιχορηγέω, (epi-choir-a-gail) lit., "the leader of a chorus, from which we get our visual of a "choir director," the director brings the seven traits together, like a choir, and directs them to work together for a purpose; we have faith from God, now, go for moral excellence, knowledge, temperance, etc.]

<u>God's Sovereignty</u>: Salvation is a *gift to be <u>received</u>*; not a *gift to be <u>earned</u>*. (Fact: It <u>cannot</u> be earned.)

<u>Man's Responsibility</u>: As followers of Christ, we must, with eagerness, seek to be characterized with *Christian excellence*.

## "Spiritual Growth is not automatic."

**2 Peter 1:5, GNT** - <sup>5</sup> Because you have His presence in you and His promises for you, do your best to <u>add "these things" to your lives...</u>

**2 Peter 1:5, JBP** – For these reasons, you must do your utmost from your side, to see that your saving faith carries with it real goodness of <u>life</u>. Your salvation must be accompanied by things like this: knowledge, self-control, endurance, devotion to God...

## 2. The SPOILS from Christian Excellence.

2 Peter 1:8–11, NASB95 -<sup>8</sup> For <u>if these qualities are yours and are increasing</u>, they render you <u>neither useless nor unfruitful</u> in the true <u>knowledge</u> of our Lord Jesus Christ. <sup>9</sup> For he who lacks these qualities is blind or short-sighted, having forgotten his purification from his former sins. <sup>10</sup> Therefore, brethren, be all the more diligent to make certain about His calling and choosing you; for as long as you practice these things, you will never stumble; <sup>11</sup> for in this way the entrance into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ will be abundantly supplied to you.

- Fruitfulness ...they render you neither useless nor unfruitful... (v. 8)
- Spiritual <u>Discernment</u> ...knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ... (You won't be) blind or short-sighted... (v. 9)
- <u>Assurance</u> of Salvation ...certain about His calling and choosing you... (v. 10.a)
- A guarantee that you will <u>never fall again</u> as long as you practice these things, you will never stumble (v. 10b) ["never fail" GNB]

## 3. The **STEPS** to Christian Excellence.

**2 Peter 1:5–7, NASB95** - <sup>5</sup> Now for this very reason also, applying all diligence, in your faith <u>supply</u> moral excellence, and in your moral excellence, knowledge, <sup>6</sup> and in your knowledge, self-control, and in your self-control, perseverance, and in your perseverance, godliness, <sup>7</sup> and in your godliness, brotherly kindness, and in your brotherly kindness, love.

- Moral Excellence virtue, holiness, morality, the decision to do what's right.
- Knowledge of God an understanding of biblical truth lived out in life.
- **Self-control** never allowing anything/one to control us except God.
- Perseverance keeping on the "narrow path" no matter what.
   Tongues (gossip), Tempers (anger), Temptations (of the flesh)
- **Godliness** "walk in view of His greatness," it's God-like-ness.
- **Brotherly Kindness** it's keeping *God first, others second, and self, dead-last.*
- Sacrificial Love it's that self-sacrificing, never-ending, all-encompassing love
  that Jesus exhibited when He came to earth to die for sin. At the heart
  of aqapē living is self-sacrifice. It's keeping God first, others second, and
  self, dead-last.

We live in such a nauseating age, one that literally is sickening to our Lord. We are interested in everything under the sun other than living an excellent Christian life.
