Healing for a Canaanite Woman's Daughter

1. The Brokenhearted Mother

Matthew 15:21–23, NLT -²¹ Then Jesus left Galilee and went north to the region of Tyre and Sidon. ²² A Gentile woman who lived there came to him, pleading, "Have mercy on me, O Lord, Son of David! For my daughter is possessed by a demon that torments her severely." ²³ But Jesus gave her no reply, not even a word. Then his disciples urged him to send her away. "Tell her to go away," they said. "She is bothering us with all her begging."

- The place—Tyre and Sidon (v. 21)
- The Plea—Heal my daughter (w. 22-23)

2. The Kindhearted Messiah

Matthew 15:24–28, NLT - ²⁴ Then Jesus said to the woman, "I was sent only to help God's lost sheep—the people of Israel." ²⁵ But she came and worshiped him, pleading again, "Lord, help me!" ²⁶ Jesus responded, "It isn't right to take food from the children and throw it to the dogs." ²⁷ She replied, "That's true, Lord, but even dogs are allowed to eat the scraps that fall beneath their masters' table."

- ²⁸ "Dear woman," Jesus said to her, "your faith is great. Your request is granted." And her daughter was instantly healed.
 - His Reminder—His ministry is to the Jews (vv. 24-26)
 - Her Response—She agrees, but asks for crumbs (w. 27-28a)
 - The Reward—Jesus immediately healed her daughter (v. 28b)

Practical Prayer Suggestions for

Praying for Your Prodigal

First, pray "Lord, change me!"

Matthew 15:22b, NLT - "<u>Have mercy on me, O Lord, Son of David!</u> For my daughter is possessed by a demon that torments her severely."

- Is there anything we've done to cause or contribute to this?
- Is there anything we, as a family/parents need to learn?

Second, pray "Lord, they are yours!"

Matthew 15:27, NLT ²⁷ She replied, "That's true, Lord, but even dogs are allowed to eat the scraps that fall beneath their masters' table."

• She realized she could not provide the needed healing.

Third, pray "Lord, change their heart!"

"The heart of the problem is the problem with the heart." - Anonymous

Luke 15:13, NLT - ¹³ "A few days later this younger son packed all his belongings and moved to a distant land, and there <u>he wasted all his</u> money in wild living.

• She realized she needed a miracle (i.e. a resurrection—new life)

Fourth, pray "Lord, bring good out of bad!"

• You may have to let sin run its course—with God's intervention.

Proverbs 13:15, KJV1861 – The way of the transgressor is hard.

Finally, "Lord, my prayers will continue until healing comes!"
