- 1. Ambitious Servants Proclaim Christ.
- 2. Ambitious Servants Prioritize God's Calling.
- 3. Ambitious Servants Persist in Service to God.
- 4. Ambitious Servants Prevail in Heartfelt Prayer.

A. Prayer Requested

Romans 15:30, HCSB –³⁰ Now <u>I appeal to you</u>, brothers, through our Lord Jesus Christ and through the love of the Spirit, to <u>join with me</u> [Gk: συναγωνίζομα (soon-agon-NEES-oh-my) from which we get our word "agony"; it pictures an athlete's strenuous discipline in his/her struggle to prevail] <u>in fervent prayers</u> to God on my behalf.

Romans 15:30, NKJV - ³⁰ Now <u>I beg you</u>, brethren, through the Lord Jesus Christ, and through the love of the Spirit, that you <u>strive together</u> with me in prayers to God for me....

B. Prayer Requests

Romans 15:31–32, NKJV -³¹ that [1] <u>I may be delivered from those in</u> <u>Judea who do not believe</u>, and [2] <u>that my service for Jerusalem may be acceptable to the saints</u>, ³² that [3] <u>I may come to you</u> [there in Rome] with joy by the will of God, and may be refreshed together with you.

- [1] To be protected from unbelievers (vv. 30-31a)
- [2] To be accepted by believers (v. 31b)
- [3] To come to Rome in time (v. 32)

God answered their fervent prayers!

- Acts 21-23 records Paul was granted spectacular deliverance that could only be attributed to God.
- Acts 21:17-21 records Paul's offering and its joyous reception that resulted in the solidarity of all the churches.

C. Prayer Raised

Romans 15:33, HCSB - ³³ The <u>God</u> [Note: God is the ONLY source or provider] of <u>peace</u> [Gk: slpńyn (ea-RAIN-a); Heb: מֵלֹלי (Sahlom), lit., "peace"; def., "The total well-being, prosperity, and security associated with God's presence among His people (Baker Encyclopedia of the Bible)] be with all of you. Amen.

Keep Romans 15 in Context:

Paul's <u>purpose</u> was to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ –v. 16
Paul's <u>parish</u> was the Gentile world –v. 18
Paul's <u>power</u> was from God alone –v. 19
Paul's <u>policy</u> was to build on no man's foundation –v. 20
Paul's <u>plan</u> was to go to Rome –vv. 22-23
