STUDY SECTION

STUDY VERSE SECTION - 1 Peter 3:13, NASB95 - ¹³ Who is there to

harm [lit., distress] YOU if YOU prove [lit., become] <u>Zealous</u> [Gk: zēlotēs, it means "intensity"] for what is good [Gk. agathos, lit. "God's good (thing)"]?

Matt. 19:16-17, NASB95 - ¹⁶ And someone came to Him and said, "Teacher, what <u>good thing</u> shall I do that I may obtain eternal life? ¹⁷ And He said to him, "Why are you asking Me about what is good? There is only One who is <u>good</u>; but if you wish to enter into life, keep the commandments."

Some Introductory Thoughts about Suffering

- 1. Suffering is part of living in a "fallen world." (John 16:33)
- 2. Suffering is unrelated to our own personal goodness. (Matthew 5:45; Luke 13:1-5)
- 3. Suffering amplifies God's message; we need a savior—His name is Jesus! (2 Pet. 3:9-10)

Two Key Passages Regarding "Suffering"

• STUDY VERSE SECTION - James 1:2–5, NASB95 -² Consider it all

jQY, [Biblical Joy is "the ability to see spiritual truths and eternal realities in the midst of any situation" (ATR)] *my brethren*, *when* [not "if"] *yOU encounter various* [a word almost untranslatable into English; it denotes 'every kind' (big, small, long, short, wide, thin, color, black, white, brief, lifelong, etc.] *trials*, ³ *knowing that the testing of your faith produces endurance.* ⁴ *And let endurance have its perfect result, so that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing.* ⁵ *But if any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all generously and without reproach, and it will be given to him.*

A. There is a *definiteness* about trials—they are coming.

B. There is an *indefiniteness* about trials—we don't know when or how big.

2 STUDY VERSE SECTION—Romans 8:28, NASB95 - 28 And we [as

Christians] <u>know</u> [intuitively and can experience personally] <u>that God causes</u> [lit., "harmonizes"] <u>all</u> [every single one—all] <u>things to work</u> [we get our English word "synergy" from this word together for <u>good</u> [Gk: agathos, lit., "God's good"] to those who (1) love God, and (2) to those who are called according to His [i.e., eternal] purpose.

A. There is something CONFIDENTIAL about our suffering *"And we know..."*

B. There is something COMPREHENSIVE about our sufferings. "...that <u>all things</u> work together..."

C. There is something CONSTRUCTIVE about our sufferings. "...for <u>good</u>..."

D. There is something CONDITIONAL about our sufferings. "...to those who love God...called according to His purposes."
