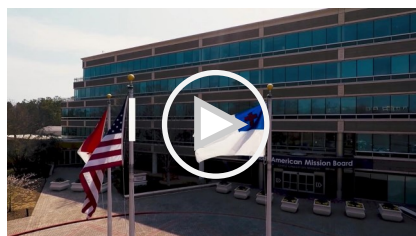

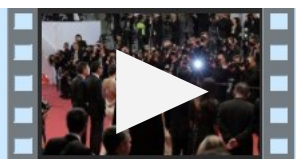

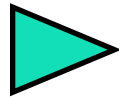

ANNIE ARMSTRONG (1850-1938)



Annie Armstrong was born in Baltimore at a time when women were not expected to lead. She served, challenged churches to action and rallied support for missionaries. Ultimately, Annie was recognized as a national Southern Baptist trailblazer renowned for visionary missions leadership.

Contributions

- Started Bay View Mission for Baltimore’s poor and addicted
- Served as the first executive of Woman’s Missionary Union
- Raised support for missionaries to Italian and Jewish immigrants
- Initiated fund-raising “brick cards” to build churches in Cuba
- Gained support for the first black, female missionaries
- Secured funds to relieve China missionary, Lottie Moon, who had served for 11 years without a furlough
- Advocated for Native Americans and impoverished mountain people
- Traveled across America in the late 1800s encouraging missionaries and inspiring churches to pray, give and act
- Honored in 1934 when The Home Missions Offering was re-named for her to encourage more to follow her sacrificial example

In our 11:00 AM service, we offer more contemporary music. These are more of the worship songs that you may have hear on Christian Radio.



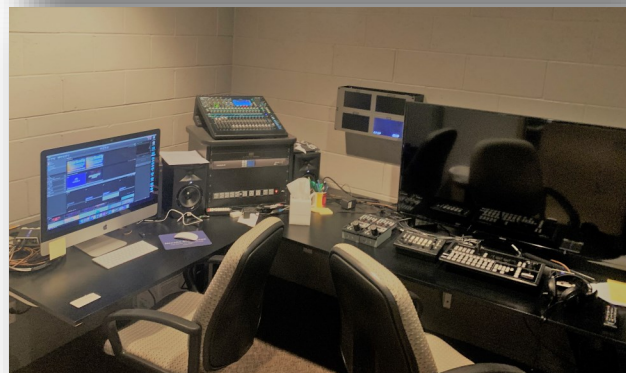
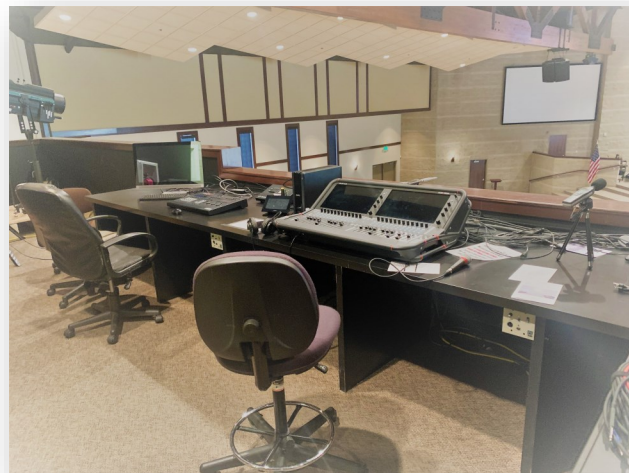

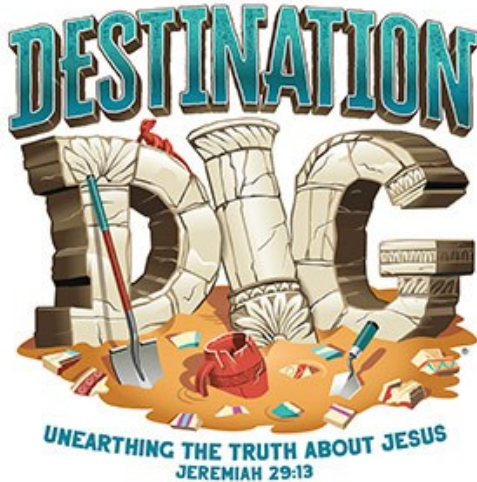
We are happy to inform the church membership, that after many years of prayer, we finally have new ovens in our kitchen. They were installed on Dec. 8, 2020.

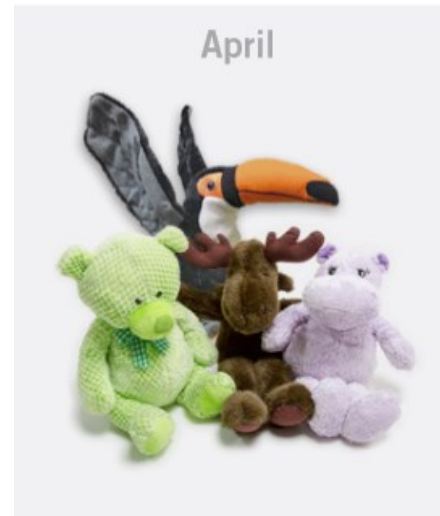
Operation Christmas Child Update

We are excited and pleased to report the official numbers from Operation Christmas Child 2020. Shoeboxes donated worldwide totaled 9,113,853, including 7,809,410 in the U.S with 415,403 built online. In our area of Northern Nevada/Eastern Sierra, we collected 15,645 shoeboxes (1,770 of those built online), an overall increase of 533 from the year before. South Reno Baptist Church accounted for 669 shoeboxes, including 11 online. The shoeboxes we packed were sent to Mexico, hard-to-reach areas of the world, and to Native Americans inside the U.S.

Our goal as a church for 2021 is 700 shoeboxes, including the 300 we again plan to pack at the annual packing party in November. But you don't have to wait until then to participate in OCC. We are collecting items for the packing party every month with collection boxes in the church lobby and church office.

We are collecting Fashion Accessories in February, Quality Crafts in March, Stuffed Animals in April, Hygiene Items in May, Quality Toys in June, New Clothing in July, School Supplies in August, and Games in September. Any sale or clearance items can be donated in any month. For information, contact Cindy Strege (775-200-4777).
