A. The Shepherd's Story-

1. The Shepherds' Reverence

Luke 2:8–9, NIV -⁸ And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. ⁹ An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified.

2. The Shepherds' Revelation

Luke 2:10–14, NIV - ¹⁰ But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. ¹¹ Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. ¹² This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." ¹³ Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, ¹⁴ "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."

3. The Shepherds' Response

Luke 2:15–16, NIV - ¹⁵ When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go

to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about."¹⁶ So they <u>hurried off</u> and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger.

4. The Shepherds' Report

Luke 2:17–19, NIV - ¹⁷ When they had seen him, <u>they spread the</u> word concerning what had been told them about this child, ¹⁸ and <u>all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said</u> to them. ¹⁹ But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered

them in her heart.

5. The Shepherds' Return

Luke 2:20, NIV - ²⁰ The shepherds <u>returned</u>, <u>glorifying and</u> <u>praising God for all the things they had heard and seen</u>, which were just as they had been told.

B. Word Study-

Luke 2:11, NASB - ¹¹ for today in the city of David there has been born for you a <u>Savior</u>, who is <u>Christ</u> the <u>Lord</u>.

Savior (σωτήρ, "so-tear") • One who saves (us from our sins).
Christ (Χριστός, "Chris-tos") • Lit., anointed one (Messiah).
Lord (κύριος, "kyr-i-os") • It refers to the divine nature of Jesus having all authority over all things—at all times.

C. Truths from The Shepherds' Life

1. They found a **<u>faith</u>** that could outweigh their **<u>fear</u>**.

Luke 2:10, NASB95 - ¹⁰ But the angel said to them, "<u>Do not be</u> <u>afraid</u>; for behold, I bring you <u>good news</u> of <u>great joy</u> which will be for <u>all the people</u>...

2. They found a **jOy** that can outweigh their **distress**.

Luke 2:10–11, NASB - ¹⁰ But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for behold, I bring you good news <u>of great joy</u> which will be for all the people; ¹¹ for today in the city of David there has been born for you <u>a Savior, who is Christ the Lord</u>.

3. They found a **<u>Peace</u>** that can outweigh their <u>storm</u>.

Luke 2:13–14, NASB - ¹³ And suddenly there appeared with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, ¹⁴ "<u>Glory to God in the highest</u>, And on earth <u>peace among men</u> with whom He is pleased." ("...who enjoy His favor." – JB)
