- 1. The Ministry of Presence—just be there.

- 1. Eliphaz's Approach (4:1-6)
 - "You have helped so many people with your preaching."
 - "Now, it's time to practice what you preach."
- 2. Eliphaz's Accusation (4:5-11)
 - "Do the innocent really suffer?"
 - "You reap what you sow, Job, and you really asked for this."
- 3. Eliphaz's Argument (4:12-21)
 - "Who ever perished being innocent, Job?"
 - "Do you really think you are not suffering because of your sin?"

Job 5:7, NASB - ⁷ For man is born for trouble....

5. Eliphaz's Appeal (5:8-17)

Here are Two Things Eliphaz got right:

Job 5:8-9, NASB -8 "But as for me, I would seek God, And I would place my cause before God; 9 Who does great and unsearchable things, Wonders without number."

Job 5:19, MSG - ¹⁹ From one disaster after another He delivers you; no matter what the calamity, the evil can't [destroy] you....

- A. Place your situation before God.
- B. Only God can deliver you.

6. Eliphaz's Assurance (5:17-22)

Job 5:17, NASB95 - 17 "Behold, how happy is the man whom God reproves, so do not despise the discipline of the Almighty."

D. Why Do Good People Suffer

- 1. We live in a fallen world (the curse is the same for everyone).
- 2. Suffering is unrelated to personal goodness (most of the time).
- 3. It could be the result of personal sin. (Numbers 32:23; Galatians 6:7-8).
- 4. It could be the result of other people's sin.
- 5. It could be a "teaching moment" from God (ie., discipline).
- 6. It could serve as encouragement to other people.
- 7. Sometimes, only God knows why we suffer.

E. Remember what Eliphaz got Right

- A. Place your situation before God.
- B. Only God can deliver you.
