# **HEAVY QUESTIONS FROM JOB**

1.	Is life fair?	Answer:		(6:1-7
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**Job 6:1–3, MSG** - <sup>1</sup> Job answered: <sup>2</sup> "If my misery could be weighed, if you could pile the whole bitter load on the scales, <sup>3</sup> <u>It would be heavier than all the sand of the sea!</u>

**Job 6:3, NASB95** - 3 ".... Therefore my words have been rash."

2. Do innocent people suffer?	Answer: _		(6:5-7)
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Job 6:5–6, NLT - <sup>5</sup> <u>Don't I have a right to complain</u>? Don't wild donkeys bray when they find no grass, and oxen bellow when they have no food? <sup>6</sup> Don't people complain about unsalted food? Does anyone want the tasteless white of an egg?

**Job 6:4, TLB** - <sup>4</sup> For the Lord has struck me down with his arrows; he has sent his poisoned arrows deep within my heart.

# 3. Do followers of God ever lose hope? Answer: \_\_\_\_\_

Job 6:8–10, TLB - 8 "Oh, that God would grant the thing I long for most—to die beneath his hand and be freed from his painful grip.

10 This, at least, gives me comfort despite all the pain—that I have not denied the words of the holy God.

4. Do we have	<i>r</i> e enough	n strength, on our own,	to make it to
the end?	Answer:	(6:11-12)	

**Job 6:11–13, TLB** - <sup>11</sup> Oh, why does my strength sustain me? How can I be patient till I die? <sup>12</sup> Am I unfeeling, like stone? Is my flesh made of brass? <sup>13</sup> For I am utterly helpless, without any hope.

# **5. "Did I ask for your help?"** Answer: \_\_\_\_\_\_ (6:13-23)

Job 6:14, NASB - 14 "For the despairing man there should be kindness from his friend; So that he does not forsake the fear of the Almighty.

- Did I ask for your input?Did I ask for your money?
- Did I ask you to protect me? Did I ask you to rescue me?
- Did I ask you to counsel me? Did I ask you for anything?
- Did I even ask you to be here? What sin(s) did I commit?

## **6. Will God be there for Job?** Answer: \_\_\_\_\_

**Job 42:1–2, 6, NASB** - <sup>1</sup> Then Job answered the LORD and said, <sup>2</sup> "I know that You can do all things, And that no purpose of Yours can be thwarted... <sup>6</sup> Therefore I retract, And I repent in dust and ashes."

**Job 19:25, NIV** - <sup>25</sup> <u>I know that my redeemer lives</u>, and that in the end he will stand on the earth.

**Job 36:5, NLT** - <sup>5</sup> "<u>God is mighty</u>, but <u>he does not despise anyone!</u> He is <u>mighty in both power</u> and <u>understanding</u>.
