Job Cries Out to God About the Following:

1. The Futility of Life.

Job 7:1–3, NLT -¹ "Is not all human life a struggle? Our lives are like that of a hired hand, ² like a worker who longs for the shade, like a servant waiting to be paid. ³ <u>I, too, have been assigned</u> months of futility, long and weary nights of misery.

2. The Brevity of Life.

Job 7:4–11, TLB -⁴ When I go to bed I think, 'Oh, that it were morning,' and then I toss till dawn. ⁵ "My skin is filled with worms and blackness. My flesh breaks open, full of pus. ⁶ My life drags by—day after hopeless day. ⁷ <u>My life is but a breath</u>, and nothing good is left. ⁸ You see me now, but <u>not for long</u>. Soon you'll look upon me dead. ⁹ <u>As a cloud disperses and vanishes, so those who</u> <u>die shall go away forever</u>—¹⁰ gone forever from their family and their home—<u>never to be seen again</u>. ¹¹ Ah, let me express my anguish. Let me be free to speak out of the bitterness of my soul.

3. The Anxieties of Life.

A. Why do You care about people, Lord?

Job 7:17, HCSB - ¹⁷ <u>What is man, that You think so highly of</u> him and pay so much attention to him?

1 Peter 5:7, NIV84 - ⁷ Cast all your anxiety on Him because He cares for you.

B. Is this life just a test, Lord?

Job 7:18, HCSB - ¹⁸ You inspect him every morning, and <u>put</u> <u>him to the test</u> every moment.

Ephesians 5:15–17, NIV84 - ¹⁵ Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, ¹⁶ making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil. ¹⁷ Therefore do not be foolish, but <u>understand what the Lord's will is</u>.

C. Will You ever forget me, Lord?

Job 7:19, HCSB - ¹⁹ <u>Will You ever look away from me</u>, or leave me alone long enough to swallow?

Isaiah 49:15, ESV - ¹⁵ "<u>Can a woman forget</u> her nursing child, that <u>she should have no compassion on the son of her</u> womb? Even these may forget, yet <u>I</u> will not forget you.

D. Have I sinned against You, Lord?

Job 7:20, NASB - ²⁰ "Have I sinned? ["<u>I have sinned</u>." (KJV)] What have I done to You, O watcher of men? Why have You set me as Your target, So that I am a burden to myself?

Romans 3:23, NLT - ²³ For <u>everyone has sinned</u>; we all fall short of God's glorious standard.

E. Will You forgive me of my sin, Lord?

Job 7:21, NIV84 - ²¹ Why do you not pardon my offenses and forgive my sins?

1 John 1:9, NASB95 - ⁹ <u>If we confess our sins</u>, <u>He is faithful</u> <u>and righteous to forgive us our sins</u> and to <u>cleanse us from</u> <u>all unrighteousness</u>.
