Women's Health Work

Thavy* travels to several lake villages each week by boat. She meets with women, tells important stories, and teaches health lessons. Last fall several of these ladies were pregnant. One of the expectant mothers, Phary, was quite a bit older than the others. In fact, she had older teenage children, so there were some snickers and jesting from the other women. Phary was embarrassed, but then Thavy began telling a story... "There was a man and his wife who were God worshipers. They were also quite old..." Thavy continued to share about this couple and the special purpose God had in allowing them to become pregnant even at an advance age.

As the women listened, they were reminded that God is the one who creates life and that he uses all kinds of circumstances to show his power, care and mercy. These truths changed the atmosphere among the women. They were more caring and encouraging to one another.

WOMEN'S MINISTRY WORKSHOPS

This vital part of our Women's Ministry Team allows us to become the hands and feet of Christ and supply many items for hurting people both locally and around the world. We usually meet four times a year for these workshops in the Fellowship Hall, on Saturdays from 9:30-2:00 and have a potluck lunch. We want to invite anyone that would like to join us at our next workshops: *Sept.17*. You don't need to know how to sew or quilt, there are many different ways you can serve and also meet some new people.

Our quilting ministry is headed up by Sydney Gray, and distributes lap quilts to church members that have major surgeries and illnesses (not Covid). Last year, 92 quilts were delivered to our church members and 555 have been lovingly made since October of 2013. In addition, The Children's Cabinet of Reno, also receives quilts for the Foster Children's - Every Child Gets A Quilt Program - and has received 198 kids quilts. Crisis Pregnancy Center has also received 74 baby quilts for their clients. They are beautiful works of art.

Pat Eby and Jackie Izquierdo work together with the sewing aspect of this ministry to put together dress kits for DAG (Dress a Girl Around the World). Our goal this year is 500 dresses. We also work with SYNC (Seeking your Niche in Christ Organization) to make sleeping bags that are distributed to kids that live in local hotels and are sleeping on the floor. Thirty have been made so far, and this is in addition to other sewing projects that come up. Salvation dolls are also made for missionaries to distribute on mission trips. Many gifts for Operation Christmas Child have also been made for our Packing Party shoeboxes, which includes school supply holders, book bags, sewing kits, dresses and dolls. The shoeboxes are distributed all over the world by Samaritan's Purse.

For non sewers, you can help with cutting, tying quilts and stuffing dolls and we are adding prep work for our OCC Packing Party this year. This will include inventory of items, unpacking, sorting and putting together school supply and hygiene items that go in all of our boxes, which means we need 500!!! Many workers are needed, so please join us.
