# A. Review and Introduction

- 1. Meet Zophar the Naamathite: Naamah was a town assigned to Judah in Joshua 15:41. "Zophar" typically means *lovely*—but not in the book of Job.
- 2. He is the third "friend" of Job to speak. He speaks only two times.
- 3. Job has heard two points from his friends: man is sinful (Eliphaz), and God is just (Bildad). Zophar now finishes with the third point: God punishes sin and gives less than we really deserve.
- 4. Zophar already considers Job guilty but came up with a formula for Job to fix himself.

# **B. Zophar's Three Accusations**

1. You are guilty before God. (vv. 1-6)

Job 11:1-6, NLT - <sup>1</sup> Then Zophar the Naamathite replied to Job: <sup>2</sup> "Shouldn't someone answer this torrent of words? Is a person proved innocent just by a lot of talking? <sup>3</sup> Should I remain silent while you

babble on? When you mock God, shouldn't someone make you ashamed? <sup>4</sup> You claim, 'My beliefs are pure,' and 'I am clean in the sight of God.' <sup>5</sup> If only God would speak; if only he would tell you what he thinks! <sup>6</sup> If only he would tell you the secrets of wisdom, for true wisdom is not a simple matter. Listen! God is doubtless punishing you far less than you deserve!

### 2. You are ignorant of God. (vv. 7-12)

Job 11:7–9, NLT -7 "Can you solve the mysteries of God? Can you discover everything about the Almighty? 8 Such knowledge is higher than the heavens— and who are you? It is deeper than the underworld—what do you know? 9 It is broader than the earth and wider than the sea.

- Can you search out the deep things of Almighty God?
- Can you find the limits of Almighty God?
- Does your understanding reach the highest heaven?
- Does your understanding reach the deepest underworld?

### 3. You are stubborn and should turn back to God. (vv. 13-20)

**Job 11:20, HCSB** - *If you don't listen to me I'll tell you what is going to happen to you.* But the sight of the wicked will <u>fail</u>.

# C. Zophar's "Fourfold Formula for Repentance"

- **1.** <u>Repentance</u> (Gk: μετάνοια, "meta-no-ee-o"); "Everything must change—our minds and our actions—from evil to good; or, from good to better." (Strong's)
- 2. Repentance (Heb. תשובה; "teh-shoo-va"); "Turn back in total surrender!"

Job 11:13–14, TLB - <sup>13</sup> ... <u>Turn [back] to God</u> and <u>stretch out your hands to him, get rid of your sins</u> and <u>leave all iniquity behind you</u>. <sup>15</sup> Only then, without the spots of sin to defile you, can you walk steadily forward to God without fear.

- 1. Surrender your heart to God.
- 2. Reach out to Him for supplication.
- 3. Stop the sin in your life.
- 4. Be made spotless by God (lit., Leave no sin in your tent.)

**Job 11:13–15, MSG** -<sup>13</sup> "...If you set your heart on God and reach out to him, <sup>14</sup> If you scrub your hands of sin and refuse to entertain evil in your [life], <sup>15</sup> You'll be able to face the world unashamed and keep a firm grip on life, guiltless and fearless.
