1. The Scroll

Revelation 5:1, NIV84 - ¹ Then I saw in the right hand of him who sat on the throne <u>a scroll</u> [GK: $\beta\iota\beta\lambda$ íov, bib-li-on gives us our word "bible"; the GK rf. an important legal document; "a deed of title" or "Last Will and Testament"; biblical scholars agree that this scroll is the title deed to the earth, which Holy God will give to Jesus Christ] with <u>writing on both sides and sealed with seven seals.</u>

Revelation 5:1, NEP -1 Then I saw Holy God sitting on the heaven's throne and in His right hand was <u>a deed of title to the known world</u>. It was a rolled scroll secured with seven wax seals.

Question: "Who is Worthy?"

2. The Search

Revelation 5:2–4, NIV84 - ² And I saw a mighty angel proclaiming in a loud voice, "Who is worthy to break the seals and open the scroll?" ³ But no one in heaven or on earth or under the earth could open the scroll or even look inside it. ⁴ I wept and wept [GK: κλαίω, kla-i-o, means "unrestrained emotion"; it's the same word describing Jesus' weeping over Jerusalem (Lk. 19:41), Peter's bitter weeping after betraying Jesus (Lk. 22:62) and weeping of the young daughter who had died (Lk. 8:52) because no one was found who was worthy to open the scroll or look inside.

Question: "Where is He the One who is worthy?"

3. The Selection

Revelation 5:5–7, NIV84 - ⁵ Then one of the elders said to me, "Do not weep! See, the <u>Lion of the tribe of Judah</u>, [a messianic title of Jesus, cf., Genesis 49;8-10] the <u>Root of David</u> [another messianic title of Jesus., cf., Isaiah 11:1, 10), has triumphed. <u>He is able to open the scroll and its seven seals.</u>" ⁶ Then I saw a <u>Lamb</u> [GK: ἀρνίον, am-i-on, lit., "little lamb", the imagery derives from the Passover, when Jewish families were required to keep the sacrificial lamb as a household pet for four days before sacrificing it (cf., Ex 12:3-6), looking as if it had been slain, standing in the center of the throne, encircled by the <u>four living creatures</u> [ie., the angels] and the elders... ⁷ <u>He</u> [ie., Jesus] <u>came and took the scroll from the right hand of him who sat on the throne.</u>

ANSWER: "Christ alone is worthy!"

4. The Solution

Revelation 5:8–14, TLB – ⁸ And as he took the scroll, the twenty-four Elders fell down before the Lamb, each with a harp and golden vials filled with incense—the prayers of God's people! ⁹ <u>They were singing</u> him a new song with these words: "You are worthy...

A. Because of Who He Is!

Revelation 5:5–7, NIV84 $-^5$...See, the <u>Lion of the tribe of Judah</u>, the <u>Root of David</u>, has triumphed. <u>He is able to open the scroll and its seven seals... ⁷ <u>He came and took the scroll from the right hand of him who sat on the throne.</u></u>

B. Because of What He Did!

Revelation 5:8–10, NIV84 - And they sang a new song: "You are worthy to take the scroll and to open its seals, because you were slain [lit., "butchered"], and with your blood you purchased men for God from every tribe and language and people and nation.....

C. Because of What He Has!

Revelation 5:11–14, NIV84 – ¹² In a loud voice they sang: "<u>Worthy is the Lamb</u>, who was slain, to receive [aorist, indicative Gk. Verb or "past tense"...Lit., "He has already received"...] <u>power [Gk. Δύναμις, rf. "dynamite"]</u> and <u>wealth [πλοῦτος, lit., "a rich one"]</u> and <u>wisdom [Gk. σοφία, lit., "full understanding"]</u> and <u>strength [Gk. ἰσχύς, lit., "mighty ability/power"]</u> and <u>honor</u> [lit., "reverence"] and <u>glory</u> [meaning "to worship"] and <u>praise</u> [Gk. Εὐλογία, rf., "eulogy" meaning "to remember" or praise for their actions]!"

Question: Why is Christ Our Only Hope?

This world is His by right of <u>Creation</u>—He made it!
This world is His by right of <u>Calvary</u>—He redeemed it!
The world is His by right of <u>Conquest</u>—He will soon retake it!
The World is His by right of <u>Capacity</u>—Only Christ can fix it.

Final Question: Is He Worthy?

Final Answer: He is!
