- C. Last Weeks Appeal: "Live your life in a manner worthy of the Gospel."
- D. This Weeks Appeal: "Be united behind one cause." (Be one, likeminded, unified.)

Message Section

____ what God does for You. (vv. 1-2)

Philippians 2:1–2, NASB - ¹ <u>Therefore</u> [Paul now expands on the previous appeal in Phil. 1:27] <u>if</u> [a first-class conditional conj.: "Paul says, 'if' not as if he doubts whether the condition is really true, but simple to emphasize that when the condition is present, the conclusion should also be present." - Dr. W. Hendriksen (DTS)] there is any <u>encouragement</u> [GK: paráklēsis: ie., 'to come alone side' to 'encourage or comfort'] in Christ, if there is any consolation of love, if there is any fellowship of the Spirit, if any affection and compassion, ² make my joy complete by being of the same mind, maintaining the same love, <u>united</u> [gives us our word, symphony] in spirit, <u>intent on one purpose</u>.

Philippians 2:1–2, MSG -¹ If you've gotten anything at all out of following Christ, if his love has made any difference in your life, if being in a community of the Spirit means anything to you, if you have a heart, if you care—² then do me a favor: Agree with each other, love each other, be deep-spirited friends.

Paul was asking, rhetorically,

- Has God done anything for you?
- Have you experienced God's love?
- Have you enjoyed fellowship with God's Spirit in you?
- Have you received an outpouring of mercy and grace from God?

_ with what sin destroys in You. (v. 3a)

Philippians 2:3, NASB - ³ <u>Do nothing</u> [an imperative command] from <u>selfishness</u> [e.g., narcissism; used only here in the NT; Aristotle used it to describe "the self-seeking pursuit of someone to an office by unfair means"] Or <u>empty conceit</u> [combines the two words "hollow" and "opinion"]....

what God demands of You. (vv. 3b-4)

Philippians 2:3b–4, NASB -³ ...but with <u>humility</u> [the operative word in this passage] of mind <u>regard one another as more important than</u> <u>yourselves</u>; ⁴ do not merely look out for your own personal interests, but also for the interests of others.

Philippians 2:3–4, MSG -³ Don't push your way to the front; don't sweet-talk your way to the top. Put yourself aside, and help others get ahead. ⁴ Don't be obsessed with getting your own advantage. Forget yourselves long enough to lend a helping hand.

Life Application Section

- A. The choice is yours: <u>Be humbled before God</u> or <u>be humbled by God</u>.
- B. We must seek to 'live a life worthy of the Gospel of Christ.'
- C. We must realize, in humility, what <u>God has done for us</u>—not what we, in pride, feel we have done for God.
- D. We must deal—once and for all—with how our sin is destroying us.
- E. We (as a church) must become united behind one cause. (See B above)
