Philippians 3:12–13, NASB95 - ¹² Not that I have already obtained it or have already become <u>perfect</u> [lit., complete and/or mature] but I <u>press on</u> [a hunting metaphor, "to chase" or "to track"] so that I may <u>lay</u> <u>hold</u> [rf., apprehend] of that for which also I was <u>laid hold of by</u> <u>Christ Jesus</u> [Paul (Saul) was apprehended in Acts 9:6ff)]. ¹³ Brethren, I do not regard myself as having <u>laid hold</u> [rf., apprehend] of it yet; but <u>one</u> <u>thing</u> [in the imperative mood, lit., "once and for all"] <u>I do</u> [the words, "I do" do not appear in the Greek text but are added for clarity]....

2. Forget the ______.

Philippians 3:13, NASB95 - ¹³ Brethren, I do not regard myself as having laid hold of it yet; but one thing I do: <u>forgetting</u> [something 'declared irrelevant'] <u>what lies behind</u> [lit., "what was placed at the altar" (it involves 'putting something down'] and <u>reaching forward</u> [pictured is an athlete running at full speed] to what lies ahead....

Philippians 3:13–14, NASB95 -¹³ Brethren, I do not regard myself as having laid hold of it yet; <u>but one thing I do</u>: forgetting what lies behind and reaching forward to what lies ahead, ¹⁴ <u>I</u> press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.

Philippians 3:13–14, NLT - ¹³ ... I focus on this one thing: Forgetting the past and looking forward to what lies ahead, ¹⁴ <u>I</u> press on to reach the end of the race and receive the heavenly prize for which God, through Christ Jesus, is calling us.

Philippians 3:13–14, TLB - ¹³ No, dear brothers, I am still not all I should be, but I am bringing all my energies to bear on this one thing: Forgetting the past and looking forward to what lies ahead, ¹⁴ I strain to reach the end of the race and receive the prize for which God is calling us up to heaven because of what Christ Jesus did for us.

Philippians 3:13–14, MSG - ¹³ I've got my eye on the goal, where God is beckoning us onward—to Jesus.

Philippians 3:18–19, NASB95 - ¹⁸ For many walk, of whom I often told you, and now tell you even weeping, that they are <u>enemies of the cross of Christ</u>, ¹⁹ <u>whose end is destruction</u>, <u>whose god is their appetite</u>, and <u>whose glory is in their shame</u>, who set their minds on earthly things.

5. Anticipate the _____

Philippians 3:20–21, NASB95 -²⁰ For <u>our citizenship is in</u> <u>heaven</u>, from which also we eagerly wait for a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ; ²¹ who will <u>transform the body</u> of our humble state into conformity with the body of His glory, by the exertion of the power that He has even to subject all things to Himself.
