Philippians 3:17, NASB95 - ¹⁷ <u>Brethren</u>, [a very endearing, loving, sincere term] *join in* <u>following</u> [an act of admiring] *my* example [Paul is an example of someone we could follow in his example], and observe [lit., admire] those who walk according to the [biblical] pattern you have [found and seen demonstrated] *in us.*

1. Their Description.

Philippians 3:18, NASB95 - ¹⁸ For <u>many</u> [think "most"] walk, of whom I often told you, and now tell you even <u>weeping</u> [for Paul knows the future of these; He has no delight in telling us—it causes him to weep, and it should cause us to weep.], <u>that they are enemies of the cross of</u> Christ....

T he cross of Jesus Christ is the theme of the Bible, the heart of the gospel, and the chief source of praise in heaven (Rev. 5:8-10). The cross is the proof of God's love for sinners (Rom. 5:8) and God hatred for sin. The cross condemns with the world's values. It judges mankind and pronounces the true verdict:*Guilty*! - Dr. Warren W. Wiersbe

1 Corinthians 1:18, NASB95 - ¹⁸ For the <u>word of the cross</u> is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

2. Their Destiny.

Philippians 3:19a, NASB95 - ¹⁹ <u>whose end is destruction</u>.... Philippians 3:19a, NLT - ¹⁹ They are headed for <u>destruction</u>. Philippians 3:19a, TLB - ¹⁹ Their future is eternal <u>loss</u>....

3. Their Dependency.

Philippians 3:19b, NASB95 - ¹⁹ whose end is destruction, <u>whose</u> god is their appetite....

Philippians 3:19b, JBP – ¹⁹...there god is to <u>appease the flesh</u>...

4. Their Dishonor.

Philippians 3:19c, NASB95 - ¹⁹ whose end is destruction, whose god is their appetite, and <u>whose glory is in their shame</u>....

Philippians 3:19c, TLB - ¹⁹ ... they are proud of what they should be ashamed of....

5. Their Delight.

Philippians 3:19d, NASB95 - ¹⁹ whose end is destruction, whose god is their appetite, and whose glory is in their shame, <u>who set</u> their minds on earthly things.

Philippians 3:19, TLB - ¹⁹ ...and all they think about is <u>this life</u> here on earth.
