URGENT MISSIONS NEED!

When speaking of being involved in missions, you've heard us say, "GO-PRAY-SEND." Or perhaps you've heard us say that you can be a "Player, Prayer or Payer." Here's a question for you, how can you PRAY or SEND if there is no one to GO; or how can you be a Prayer or Payer if there is no Player?

We need a couple of Players!

We are sending a small mission's team to Lahore, Pakistan (please read "Safety In Missions" in the church newsletter/web site/ email) from October 17th to October 28th and we urgently need **TWO** more missions minded servants to join the team of five. This city of over 13 million people is safer than the majority of U.S. cities, according to the World Safety Index by City-2021. We will primarily be prayer walking and sharing Jesus alongside Pakistani Christians. We will stay with our IMB missionary and his family or at the Jesuit Mission, near the local Christian College. The cost is a \$500 deposit plus your spending money (souvenirs, gifts, etc.). We need to know who will GO, by September 17th, in order to get the airline tickets. SAFETY IN MISSIONS

Lahore is Pakistan's second-largest city, considered around the world to be the country's cultural capital. It's also considered to be much safer than most other cities in Pakistan. Considering other places in Pakistan marred by lawlessness, Lahore is a generally a safer place to live or visit. It is not only a safe place for you to travel but it's the most adventurous and liveliest city of Pakistan.

You will find peace and harmony there and people living their lives to the fullest.

It doesn't matter if you know anyone there or not, people are nice there with a kind and friendly nature and provide a hospitable environment for the outsiders.

Of course, tourists in Lahore are strongly advised against visiting political gatherings.

Even though it's a country filled with friendly people, these gatherings might escalate into a protest that can turn violent and in some cases deadly, as we have seen in Seattle, Portland, Minneapolis, etc. Not all parts of Lahore are safe so a lot depends on which part of the city you're located in.

Mugging, snatching, getting robbed and similar forms of petty crime does happen in some parts of the city, but it's not very common.

I have researched the world's Safety Index by City for Mid-Year 2021. If the city has a high safety index, it is considered very safe. If it has a low safety index it is not as safe.

The safest city in the world is Doha, Qatar with a Safety Index of 88.08. The least safe city in the world is Caracas, Venezuela with a Safety Index of 15.48.

Lahore, Pakistan has a Safety Index of 61.36. Cities in the United States with a Safety Index lower than Lahore, Pakistan include:

Plus 20 other U.S. cities, including the least safe U.S. city of Baltimore, MD with a Safety Index of 24.95. So if you have the opportunity to go to Lahore, Pakistan on a mission trip, remember that it is safer than many cities in our own United States of America!
