A. Message Section

HERE'S WHAT WE SEE ON THE FIRST PALM SUNDAY:

1. How the People Responded.

Luke 19:37–38, NASB - ³⁷ As soon as He was approaching, near the descent of the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the miracles which they had seen, ³⁸ shouting: "BLESSED IS THE <u>KING</u> WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD; Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"

2. How the Pharisees Responded.

Luke 19:39, NLT - ³⁹ But some of the Pharisees among the crowd said, "Teacher, rebuke your followers for saying things like that!"

3. How the Lord Responded.

Luke 19:40, NLT - ⁴⁰ He replied, "If they kept quiet, <u>the stones</u> along the road would burst into cheers!"

B. Focus Section

WHILE THE CROWD WAS <u>REJOICING</u>, CHRIST WAS <u>WEEPING</u>:

Luke 19:41–42, NLT -⁴¹ But as He came closer to Jerusalem and saw the city ahead, <u>He began to weep</u>. ⁴² "How I wish today that you of all people would understand the way to peace. But now it is too late, and peace is hidden from your eyes.

- 1. When He looked <u>back</u>, He saw a nation ignorant of "their visitation."
- 2. When He looked within, He saw their spiritual blindness.
- 3. When He looked <u>around</u>, He saw *religious activity* that mattered not.
- 4. When He looked ahead, He saw judgment coming upon the nation.

C. Life Application Section

HIS TEARS WERE THE RESULT OF WHAT THEY MISSED:

- 1. Your day—your opportunity ("Time is Short").
- 2. Your peace—your reconciliation with God.
- 3. Your eyes—didn't see who Jesus was.
- 4. Your visitation—with the Savior—with you, seeking to save you.

Luke 19:41–44, TLB -⁴¹ But as they came closer to Jerusalem and he saw the city ahead, he began to cry. ⁴² "<u>Eternal peace was within your reach</u> and you turned it down," he wept, "and now it is too late. ⁴³ Your enemies will pile up earth against your walls and encircle you and close in on you, ⁴⁴ and crush you to the ground, and your children within you; your enemies will not leave one stone upon another—<u>for you have</u> rejected the opportunity God offered you."
